

# A-Z Fundraising Ideas

<a href="#">Amazon Smile</a>	Amazon will donate 0.5% of your purchase to us as no cost to you. Simply register and shop away!
Bake sale	Bake sales have long been a staple of fundraising activities. Volunteers and supporters of your cause bake and donate cakes, cookies, buns, muffins, pies and biscuits. These are then sold to raise funds.
Charity Climb	How about organising a vertical challenge? Perhaps a relay challenge to climb to the height of Snowdon? Feeling more adventurous? How about the height of Everest!
Dress Down Day	Make a donation to dress down at work for the day. Wear your casual clothes or pyjamas, or perhaps dress up!

How many sweets in a jar?	A large jar is filled with a carefully counted number of sweets. People then try to guess how many sweets are in the jar. Guesses are recorded on a sheet of paper numbered off so that no-one chooses the same number as a previous guess. Entrants pay a small fee to guess.

Jumble sale	<p>A jumble sale can be done on any weekend. All you have to do is inform people about the event.</p> <p>On the day of the event, you just need a few tables and a few people who can manage the money.</p> <p>People are usually generous at doing this, so you can turn this fundraising idea into a regular feature.</p>
Knitting Competition	Get crafty. Whether it's a scarf, tie, Christmas jumper or silly socks, this is bound to be a winner.
Leg wax	How much would your friends be willing to pay to see this? Challenge them to join you!
Marathon	<p>A marathon work well with sponsorships. Get each covered mile sponsored by different sponsors. That makes getting sponsorship easy.</p> <p>Doing this by convincing a gym, or shoe store is a unique fundraising idea.</p>
Name the... bear, bunny, teddy	Why not get a local business to donate a big teddy and hold a 'name the

	teddy' competition. You could come up with a list of names where people can buy the name that they think it is called. You can then give the teddy as the prize.
Obstacle Course	<p>This one is much more interesting than a standard race. It is a race, but at the same time it is much more than that – a real test of talent and timing that is more exciting and rewarding.</p> <p>Also, when looking for engagement from the public, it tends to be the case that the more special the task, the higher the willingness for participation.</p> <p>Tickets for those who wish to see the contest will raise a lot of revenue. A bonus? The refreshments that you can sell during the event.</p>
Plant Sale	<p>Make sure you do it in is a season that is ideal for planting, so spring and summer mainly.</p> <p>You will have plan well ahead to sow a variety of seeds, and prepare the saplings in time for sale.</p>
Quiz night	<p>Everyone loves a pub quiz! Invite friends and family to a virtual zoom quiz. Either host and ask all the questions or invite each group to write a round. Don't forget the picture and music questions.</p>
Raffle	<p>Urge your friends and neighbours to make generous donations, and market your raffle with children's creative efforts.</p>
Savoo	<p>We've partnered with Savoo to make it even easier to support our life saving work. Use Savoo as your default search engine, and they will donate 1p to us every time you search.</p>
Talks	<p>Are you part of a community group who might be interested in out work? We have a number of speakers available who may be able to attend your venue. A small remuneration would be nice.</p>
Used book sale	<p>Ask your school, your family, your neighbour, and friends to donate books that they no longer read. These can then be sold to raise funds for education.</p> <p>Want to know the best part? It not only raises funds, but also fosters the habit of reading.</p>
Vehicle Rally	<p>Are you into cars or motorcycles? Why not hold your own rally? If you are part of a bike or car club why not get them involved too?</p>
Walkathon	<p>Walking, a great way to see a city, or the countryside – or even both!</p> <p>Get some friends to join, and all fundraise for your favourite cause. It would be a great way to bond while making a big difference to causes you care about.</p>
Xbox tournament	<p>Gaming is a great way to stay in contact with friends when you can't see them face-to-face. Set up a gaming tournament, ask for donations to join in or place bets, and give winnings to your charity or good cause. You'll be raising money and having a great time too!</p>
Yoga	<p>Get flexible and get fundraising with this stress-busting activity</p>
Zumbathon	<p>The basic premise of a Zumba fundraiser is a group class, or party as it is sometimes called, with money raised going to support us. Participants pay money to participate in the event, which can last for an hour, or longer in the case of a Zumbathon.</p>
